- Online entries will carry a booking fee. Postal entries will only be accepted upon receiving entry, fee and stamped address envelope.
- Prize money will be given in the form of a cheque, which can be cashed over the weekend at the Ice Bank on the show ground.
- Trophies will be held for 1 year. Winners of trophies will be expected to take part in the Grand Parade at the end of each day before receiving the trophy.
- All competitors must wear wrist bands at the entry gate and clearly display parking passes.
- Timetable will be displayed via the show website and Facebook in the week previous to the show.
- All children entering classes must be accompanied by an adult.
- All riders must wear a correct standard hat at all times.
- All horses entering the showground must be accompanied with a correct passport.
- Correct show etiquette is expected at all times and the judges decision is final.
- Classes affiliated to specific bodies must follow rules provided in their given rule books.

1. Private Driving  
Horse or pony, 4 years old or over, driven to a traditional or traditional type vehicle. A traditional vehicle means a vehicle of traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of a carriage built prior to the First World War. The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyred vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible.
2. Tradesman's Turnout  
Open to horses and ponies, 4 years old or over, singles and pairs to a traditional or traditional type trade vehicle. No goods to be carried or displayed. A small sample load may be carried on a coster turnout only.
3. Exercise Vehicles  
Open to horses & ponies, 4 years old or over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (i.e., not car tyres). Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability.
4. Concours D 'Elegance  
Open to singles, pairs, multiples, 4 years old or over, to a traditional type vehicle. The essence of the class is the word 'elegance' and the winner will be the turnout, which, in the opinion of the Judge, presents the most elegant effect. To include vehicle, horse, driver, passenger etc. but above all the general impression. Attention may be paid to drivers/passengers' personal costume, but fancy dress or period costume is definitely barred. The whole object of the class is to establish which turnout presents the most pleasing picture and normal judging criteria does not apply. It is judged from a distance and vehicles are NOT closely inspected. To be driven at park pace.

The Horse & Country Racehorses (HCR) series is open to Thoroughbreds and Standardbreds who have raced, trained or been bred to race. Racing injuries will be ignored providing the horse is sound. Riders must be 14 years plus, ridden horses must be 4 years plus and veterans are 12 years plus. Judges will not ride and you will not be asked to gallop as a ride but maybe asked to gallop in your individual show. HCR members must carry their cards in the ring for signing at qualifying shows and non members must send their qualification cards (presented by the judge), fees and register with HCR after the qualifying show. To qualify you should be placed 1st-4th (qualifications may be passed down to 6th place). All handlers/riders and horses must become registered with HCR ahead of the championships and must have qualified in order to compete at the HCR championships at Netherton Equestrian on 7th / 8th September 2024. If unable to attend 2024 Championships, the qualification will carry over to 2025.
